THE IMPORTANCE OF OILING



HOW MUCH?

An average full clip should use around 30ml of oil. As a guide, the 60ml bottle of oil supplied in Lister horse clippers is how much you should be using for 1-2 full clips.

Oil the clipper head & along the blade teeth before you begin & then across your blade teeth every 5-10 minutes during a clip. It is super important to hold your clippers facing down while oiling, & even more important to then wipe any excess oil off the back of the bottom blade. This prevents the oil tracking back into the clipper motor & causing damage

THINKING ABOUT THE WHY...

The reason why you are oiling is to reduce friction and heat. Clipper blades run metal-onmetal at a high speed, so if you don't oil enough, the blades will overheat. Overheating can not only effect blades but could also transfer through to the clipper motor & trip an overload switch





WHAT NOT TO USE

Never use any type of vegetable oils as when they heat up and cool down, they start to "gum" up as well as attract hair, dirt & dust. Only use the correct clipping oil - our Acto Equine clipper oil is a specially formulated mineral oil which keeps heat and friction to a minimum during horse clipping.

TAKE A REFRESHER

It is important to follow the manufacturers guide for oiling points on both your blades & clipper head. If you haven't glanced over the instructions for a while, take a fresh look to remind yourself of where & how often to oil
